Plus, much more, as we continue refining and enhancing the structure of the Tour.

Since our formation, we have worked hard to keep FootGolf affordable and accessible for all. However, rising event-related costs — in some cases increasing by over 200% — have resulted in a third financial loss within the past three years. To protect the quality and sustainability of our events, we will be implementing a block increase in memberships and entry fees for the first time since 2022.

Our dedication to delivering high-quality bespoke FootGolf experiences remains stronger than ever as we look ahead to 2026 and beyond. Thank you for your continued support — we look forward to another outstanding season together.

Working with our partners — **FGAoE Lottery**, **The FootGolf Ball**, and **InteleTravel** — plays a vital role in supporting our Association throughout the seasons, with each partnership generating income through member use.

Every lottery subscription provides monthly support for our National team funding. The FootGolf Ball generates royalties from each sale, all of which return to the Association. InteleTravel also contributes a percentage from every FootGolfer booking, helping to reduce the organisation's financial pressures. By supporting these partners, you not only enjoy personal benefits but also directly reinvest into the sport — strengthening the Association and enhancing your experience as players throughout the seasons.

3. FGAoE Membership

Membership Requirements – English FootGolfers

To compete in Club, Regional, and National Tour events, players must hold the following membership(s):

1. FootGolf Association of England (FGAoE), Recreational
Mandatory for participation in all official FGAoE-sanctioned events.
2. FootGolf Association of England (FIFG), Tour
Required for players competing in Regional, National, or International (World Tour) events.

Membership Fees

Membership Type	Fee	Description
FGAoE Recreational Membership	£8	For Club League matches & Midweek FootGolf.
FGAoE Tour Membership	£30	Required for Regional, National, and FIFG World Tour events.

Membership Requirements – Non-English FootGolfers (UK-based)

To compete in English Club, Regional, and National Tour events, the following apply:

1. FGAoE Membership (FREE)
Basic registration required for all participants.
2. FGAoE Recreational Membership (£8)
Allows participation in Club League matches, Midweek FootGolf and Finals weekend in England only.
3. Federation for International FootGolf (FIFG)
Players must obtain FIFG membership from their home country's FootGolf organisation, as per FIFG regulations.

Note: Non-English players residing in England may represent England if permitted under FIFG rules.

- Membership Validity:
All memberships run from 1st January to 31st December each year.
- Club Matches Only Option:
If you plan to play exclusively at club level, the FGAoE Recreational Licence (£8) is sufficient for both English and non-English players.

4. Competitive FootGolf Overview

4.1 National Tour Overview

The National Tour consists of officially sanctioned events held at selected courses across England. Players compete for ranking points, trophies, and qualification toward international competitions. The tour is designed to challenge all ability levels while maintaining a professionally operated and welcoming environment.

4.2 Club League

The Club League forms the foundation of competitive FootGolf, offering regular team-based matches between clubs across the country. It provides players of all abilities with accessible competition, supports local club growth, and serves as a stepping stone toward Regional and National Tour participation.

Playing Category Qualification

Category Definitions (Birth Year Based):

- **Man:** A man born between **1981 & 2008**.
- **Junior:** A player born in **2008 or later**.
- **Woman:** A woman born between **1981 & 2008**.
- **Man, Senior:** A man born between **1970 & 1980**.
- **Man, Senior+:** A man born in **1970 or earlier**.
- **Woman, Senior:** A woman born in **1980 or earlier**.

FGAoE Amateur, Rookie & Men, Senior++ Eligibility – 2026 (English located players only)

- Did **not** win an FGAoE or FIFG accredited competition, **Category C or higher**.

Men, Senior+ (Amateur)

- Completed the 2025 season outside **Top 3** – National Rankings
- Did **not** win an FGAoE or FIFG accredited competition, **Category C or higher**.
- Did **not** qualify for the **2024/25 National Team**, including non-inclusion.

Rookie

- 2025 National Tour point average of **1500 or less**
- Did **not** win an FGAoE or FIFG accredited competition, **Category C or higher**.
- Did **not** qualify for the **2024/25 Development Team**, including non-inclusion.
- **New player in 2026**

Men, Senior++

- Man born in 1960 or earlier.

Additional Rule

- Any FootGolfer who has ever won an **FIFG500 or higher**, or has ever won an **FIFG National Team** event, **will not qualify** for an FGAoE amateur ranking in any category.
- All Junior FootGolfers moving to adult FootGolf will start in the Rookie category.

The FGAoE 2026 National Tour Season Tickets offer great value. The **Individual** including **Team Player Series** is **£880** and the **Individual** only ticket is **£835**—both include full access to all National Tour events, **including the English Open**, providing significant savings over single-event entry fees.

- Available from 1st January – 31st March 2026

The **English Open** will feature an **early bird entry fee for the first two months**, after which the **standard entry fee** will apply.

*The **Tour Championship entry fee** includes lunch upon arrival on Saturday, breakfast Sunday morning, and lunch on Sunday. The **Tour Championship entry fee (Day 2 only)** includes a breakfast and lunch on Sunday.

Junior participants will be charged 50% of the standard entry fee.

The Scottish Open & Welsh Open will be National Tour Category C event for all categories.

6.5 Event Registration

Event Registration is open to all players in our **inclusive FootGolf environment**. To participate, players must hold a **full FGAoE membership**. All FGAoE competitions will have a **default entry limit of 72 competitors**, at which point a **waitlist** will be activated. Any additional entrants will be added on a **first-come, first-served basis**, subject to **event approval**, ensuring fair and organised participation for all competitors.

The FGAoE offer a **Direct Debit** option to all members at a figure to suit your budget, event entry will only be available when credit covers the event costs. Contact fgaengland@gmail.com

6.6 Event Kit & Clothing

Approved Attire

- A collared shirt (single layer).
- Tailored or smart shorts; women may also wear tailored shorts, skirts, or skorts.
- Long socks worn pulled up to the knee.
- Caps are permitted, including baseball caps and flat caps.

Footwear

- Players must wear shoes specifically designed for AstroTurf or indoor sports.
- Cleats of any kind are strictly prohibited.

Not Permitted

- Football boots.
- Clothing displaying football club badges.
- Tracksuit bottoms.
- Denim of any kind.

6.7 Event Scoring

All FGAoE competitions are administered through Golf Genius, including both player and team registrations. Players must have the Golf Genius app installed on a handheld device and be prepared to complete live scoring whenever required.

In addition, the FGAoE uses BlueGolf in accordance with the Federation for International FootGolf (FIFG) guidelines for accredited events. Players must have the BlueGolf FIFG app always installed and ready for use.

All players are also Paper markers track kicks and penalties for their assigned player. Check the scorecard after each hole and at the end, then sign and submit. Both marker and player must sign; errors or missing signatures can lead to penalties or disqualification.

Live scoring on your own device is mandatory, and players do so at their own risk.

6.10 Player Caddie

6.11 Event Prize Pots & Event Awards

The FGAoE offers **event prize pots** at our **Category A events** throughout the season. Prize pot amounts are determined based on **player participation** in each specific event.

- **Tour Championships**: £750 for 72+ participants, or £500 for 55–71 participants
- **Brainstrust Grand Final**: £750 for 72+ participants, or £500 for 55–71 participants

Note: In 2025, the FGAoE invested £10,700 in trophies and medals, adding to £16,000 in prize money and £5,000 in tour credit, demonstrating our ongoing commitment to celebrating your success on and off the course.

6.12 Season National & Regional Rankings

Points are accumulated throughout the season across all events, with all points contributing to the relevant player rankings. Podium positions (top 3) will be determined using the FGAoE play-off system, while points for all remaining positions will be shared.

National Tour: All available events are eligible, with each player's best 16 scores counting towards their end-of-year ranking.

Regional Tour: Includes Regional Open events, add-on events, all Regional Club League matches, and other regional events, with each player's best 6 scores counting towards their end-of-year ranking.



7. Team Player Series

The **Team Player Series** comprises seven (7) events throughout the season, with each player's best six (6) results contributing to their end-of-year ranking. The competitions feature a variety of formats, each assigned a ranking value from Category A through Category C, ensuring a balanced and competitive points structure across the series. Absolute category awards presented to the Top 3 pairings.

The overall rankings will for 2026 include new categories: **“Senior only,” “Women only,”** and **“Junior only.”** These categories are designed for pairings within the same group to compete for end-of-season awards. This optional enhancement allows players to compete against others in their own category, promoting a higher level of competition and recognition within each group.

8. Regional Tour Super Cup

8.1 Qualification

The Regional Tour Super Cup marks the opening of the National Tour and serves as the first event of each season. The competition features regional squads of 17 players, from which a matchday team of 13 is selected, leaving 4 substitutes. Teams compete in three round-robin group matches to determine the finalists. The event is played entirely in a match-play format, creating a highly competitive and entertaining start to the season.

9. National Team

9.1 FIG World Cup

The FIG World Cup is held every two years. Qualification for the 2026 edition was completed during the 2025 season, and England will send three squads to Mexico: Men – Men, Senior, and Women.

The next World Cup will take place in 2028, with the host nation yet to be announced. Qualification will be open to all English members and will be conducted during the 2027 season.

9.2 FIG European Championships

England intends to field **Men's, Women's, and Senior** national teams at the 2027 FIG European Championships.

Qualification will be determined through performance across the **2026 National Tour season**, with ranking points awarded at all **Category A, B, and C National Tour events and will be highlighted in the "European Championships qualification – category"**.

Club League Finals (Category C) **are excluded** from the qualification pathway.

The best 12 scores count towards your European Championships qualification.

Qualified Players, £500 European Championships deposit required by no later than 30th November.

9.3 4-Nations Cup

The 4-Nations Cup is held every two years. Qualification for the 2026 edition was completed during the 2025 season, and England will send a 30-person squad to Wales as we look to retain the trophy.

The next 4-Nations Cup will take place in 2028; the event will take place in Scotland. Qualification will be open to all English members and will be conducted during the 2027 season.

9.4 Brainstrust Cup

England will host the brainstrust Cup in 2027 as we look to send a 30-person squad to the event. Qualification will be determined through performance across the **2026 National Tour season**, with ranking points awarded at all **Category A, B, and C National Tour events and will be highlighted in the “brainstrust Cup qualification – category”**.

Club League Finals (Category C) **are excluded** from the qualification pathway.

The best 12 scores count towards your brainstrust cup qualification.

Qualified Players, £75 brainstrust Cup deposit required by no later than 30th November.

9.5 Development Cup

The Development Cup is an annual event contested between England and Scotland, with hosting duties alternating each year. Its Ryder Cup–style format creates an exciting and engaging competition for both players and spectators.

The **2026 edition** will see us travel to Scotland in September, aiming to lift the trophy for the first time after our narrow defeat in 2025. The squad will consist of **30 players**, selected across all categories in which players earned their places during the 2025 season.

Looking ahead, **qualification for the 2027 event** will begin anew during the 2026 season.

Additional Rules:

1. If the **National Tour Rookie Champion** is also the **Regional Tour Rookie Champion**, the National Tour result takes precedence. In this situation, the qualifying place associated with the Regional Tour Rookie title is transferred to the **National Amateur Rankings**.

2. **Juniors**, who did not represent England in 2026 in the 4-Nations Cup are eligible.

9.6 Qualification Rulings

1. Ranking System

The overall ranking structure is made up of the following components:

- **National Ranking:** Best **16** scoring events
- **National Team Qualification:** Best **12** scoring events
- **Regional Ranking:** Best **6** scoring events from Regional Tour events
- **Team Player Series (TPS):** Best **6** scoring events from the TPS

2. Regional Tour Champion – Selection Priority

- If a player wins the **Regional Tour** and also finishes within the **National Team qualification** positions, the **Regional Tour title takes priority**.
- From **2nd place onward**, the National Team qualification list moves **down by one position** to accommodate the Regional Tour Champion.

3. Team Player Series (TPS) Champion – Selection Priority

- If a player wins the **Team Player Series** and qualifies through the National rankings, the **TPS title takes priority**.
- From **2nd place onward**, the National qualification list moves **down by one position** to accommodate the TPS Champion.

4. Dual Champion – Regional & National

- If a player wins **both** the Regional Tour and the National Tour, the **National Tour qualification** takes priority.
- The Regional Tour qualification list will then adjust in line with **Rule 7**, moving players down by one position in the National Team qualification rankings.

5. Qualification by Category

- All players compete in the **Category** they registered for through the FGAoE membership system at the **start of the season**.



6. Unavailability of Qualified Players

If a qualified player becomes unavailable:

- **National Team Qualification:**
 - The **next highest-ranked player** moves up into the vacant position.
- **Regional Club League:**
 - Rankings shift **down one place**, following the principles outlined in **Rule 7**.

7. Defining a Champion

If no clear champion can be determined in either the Regional Tour or National Tour:

- The qualifying place is awarded to the **highest-ranked player within the top three** of each competition (or **top four** for the TPS).
- If that player is unavailable, the position is given to the **next highest player** in the National Team qualification rankings.

8. Minimum Participation Requirement

To be eligible for qualification, a player must compete in at least:

- **Eight National Tour Individual events (Category C or above)**



10. End of Season Awards Dinner

The End of Season Awards Dinner is a vital moment in the FGAoE calendar, bringing our community together to celebrate the achievements, progress, and spirit that have driven FootGolf forward throughout the year. It is also a night to involve and bring partners, recognising the invaluable support networks behind our players, volunteers, and officials.

By honouring everyone who contributes to the game's success, the event strengthens our shared commitment to raising standards and growing the sport across England. As the FGAoE continues to move forwards, this special evening highlights how far we've come—and the exciting future we're building together.
